
Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) Process for Patients

What is Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD)?

- It involves a physician or nurse practitioner giving an individual medication at their request, that causes their death
- It is a legal medical service in Canada
- Only individuals who are found eligible (meet all of the eligibility criteria, listed below) can receive MAiD

What are the MAiD Eligibility Criteria?

- √ 18 years of age or older;
- ✓ capable making decisions about their health;
- ✓ eligible for health services funded by the federal government, or a province or territory
- ✓ make a voluntary request for MAID that is not because of external pressure;
- ✓ give informed consent after having been informed about options to relieve suffering, including palliative care;
- ✓ have a "grievous and irremediable medical condition", which is defined as:
 - having a serious and incurable illness, disease or disability;
 - being in an advanced state of irreversible decline in capability;
 - experiencing enduring physical or psychological suffering that is intolerable to the individual and cannot be relieved under conditions that they consider acceptable

What else should I know?

- Only you (the patient) can request and consent to MAiD
- You can revoke your consent to MAiD at any point before the procedure begins
- A substitute decision maker or family member cannot make decisions about MAiD on your behalf
- MAiD can happen in hospital, at home, or elsewhere in the community
